



ANNEX II

Port restrictions / Regulations

Your vessel agrees to comply with the following conditions to ensure the safe discharging/loading of cargo:

1. Ballast overflow is strictly prohibited.
2. Photos and video of the Port is strictly prohibited.
3. Vessel's Immobilization is strictly prohibited.
4. Avoid polluting the sea and the factory's area.
5. All the deck deep trays to be in position.
6. All the deck scupper plugs to be secured.
7. Cargo hold bilges pumping out is strictly prohibited.
8. Cleaning, washing or maintenance on the deck or any exterior surface is strictly prohibited
9. Engine repairs are strictly prohibited.
10. Sewage disposal is strictly prohibited.
11. HOT and COLD works are strictly prohibited unless there is permission from the Port captain and the harbor master.
12. Fishing is strictly prohibited.
13. Walking on the shore is strictly prohibited at all times, except from deck officers for draft checking and only while wearing PPE.
14. Bunkering is strictly prohibited.
15. Delivery of lubricants with tanker truck is strictly prohibited.
16. Lubricants in drums, paints and other chemicals can be delivered to the vessel only with the use of cargo nets. Otherwise, the above-mentioned stores can only be hand carried on board the vessel by her crew.
17. The overboard discharge of hold or bilge washings is prohibited within port limits.
18. Rat guards are to be rigged on all mooring lines.
19. Due to the fact that the port is not a designated Schengen point, crew changes at this port are not possible. Shore passes are not available.
20. Safety drills can be performed only during port working hours and only after permission from the Port captain.
21. Garbage disposal to the port reception facilities is permitted only for categories A, B, C (PLASTIC, DOMESTIC, and FOOD WASTE) following port captains' permission.
22. Vessel's must changeover to Low Sulphur Bunkers, as soon as possible after arrival or berthing or anchoring (within about 2 hours) as per EU directive 2016/802 .
